

Leukemia is a cancer of the blood characterized by the rapid growth of abnormal white blood cells. This uncontrolled growth takes place in the bone marrow where cells are made. These abnormal cells crowd out other developing cells like red blood cells. There are many types of leukemias with varying prognoses.



With lymphomas, cancer cells form in the lymph system with 2 main types: Hodgkins and Non-Hodgkins. Hodgkins often affects young adults and is often cured. Symptoms Non-Hodgkins Hodgkins may include night sweats, swollen lymph nodes, & fever.



Early stage prostate cancer rarely causes symptoms. Issues that may occur as the disease progresses include frequent, urgent need to urinate, weak urine flow that stops and starts, pain, burning on urination, pain in your low back, hip, or chest.



Thyroid

Thyroid cancer starts in a small gland at the base of your neck, just above your trachea. The thyroid produces hormones that regulate your metabolism, helps to control body temperature, blood pressure and heart rate. Thyroid cancer is often highly treatable with an excellent cure rate.



Gynecological



Gynecological cancers include ovarian, uterine/endometrial, cervical, vulvar, and vaginal. These are cancers of the female reproductive system. Screening conducted regularly can result in the detection of certain types of gynecologic cancers in their earlier stages, when treatment is more likely to be successful and a complete cure is a possibility. Other cancers, such as ovarian, may not have symptoms or generalized symptoms (i.e. bloating, abdominal pain, feeling full quickly) until later stages. Regular gynecological check-ups are essential.

From the Desk of Nancy Church, RN

None of us like to think of children having cancer. It is always associated with anxiety and fear of what the future holds. There is often long travels for diagnosing, treatment, and follow-up since children are treated at clinics and hospitals that specialize in pediatrics cancers. The youngest child that we have cared for with cancer was only four years old. The mother was driving an hour away for just a blood draw since the blood was drawn through a specialty line. Fortunately, someone knew about BCCS and our nurse was able to visit in the home. The difference it made for the family and the child was remarkable as a strong bond developed with the BCCS nurse.



In discussing with families the impact of childhood cancer has on children, a common thread that reoccurs is how the cancer diagnosis changes the family dynamics. The family focus suddenly changes as intense treatment is needed for the affected child. Overwhelming schedule changes occur for the family, affecting not only the child going through the treatment, but for other children in the family. Some of these dynamics continue past the treatment time. There may be physical changes as a result of the cancer and/or treatment and emotional issues to deal with.

So what are some ideas to support families impacted by cancer? Be helpful specific!

- Offer to do laundry, clean the house, mow the lawn, help with yard work, drive siblings to and from activities, shovel sidewalks, walk the dog, give the family a gift card for gas or for a take-out meal you get the idea!
- Offer to set up a calendar of support for food or other needs just make sure that it is wanted and you are committed to make it work. There are numerous websites including: carecalendar.org; lotsahelpinghands.org; mealtrain.com
- Offer a sympathetic ear, understanding that lengthy discussions may not always be feasible. Simple gestures of kindness can make a tremendous difference and are not forgotten.


