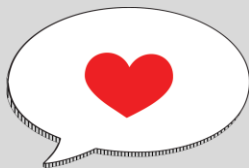

From the Desk of Nancy Church, RN

There is a Japanese proverb that declares, “The bamboo that bends is stronger than the oak that resists.” This has certainly been a year of turmoil and upheaval. In the midst of it, I am challenged to become more flexible, more understanding, and more able to meet the needs around me. It is the storms in life that often make us aware of how much we need each other.

As a nurse who has worked at the BCCS for over 25 years, I have witnessed many changes in healthcare and how cancer is treated. Treatments are being produced that utilize the body’s immune system in ways that we could only dream of when I started here in 1994.

We at BCCS are also changing. Back in November 2018, we moved into the Marie Yeager Cancer Center in order to be more available to many of our patients and more relevant to our community. Some of the barriers that physical distance creates have dissipated as people can more easily obtain needed equipment, items such as wigs and turbans, as well as extra nutritional supplements for days when eating is difficult.

When COVID-19 hit the area like a whirlwind, it was important to us to make sure that each patient had the best plan in place for being as safe as possible. I sat down with the nurses who make the home visits and discussed each person with them. I was again deeply touched by the needs of people here in southwest Michigan and the barriers that they face as they deal with cancer treatment and all that it entails. It reinforced to me how important those skilled nursing visits are for the patients that we care for. Our nurses are reaching out to those who do not have a safety net.

These nursing and supportive services that we provide fill a gaping hole in our healthcare. It is you, the community, that has provided that support since our humble beginnings in 1948. Some of you have collected pennies and given donations since you were kids. Your contributions keep our nurses going from house to house in all kinds of weather. Your support of donated durable medical equipment, medical supplies, and many other items enable us to share them with others. You telling a friend, neighbor, or family member about BCCS gives them hope of receiving needed help.

This year we have had to change how we receive the gifts from the community. Pennies for Patients Day became a virtual event. The schools, churches, and businesses that so faithfully support us each year were not meeting and people were staying home. Some found creative ways to give and many of you mailed in checks or gave online. Thank you for those very special paper pennies.

Another important area that we are in the process of changing is our social media outreach. We have been blessed by some very talented volunteers who share our vision of caring. They have spent countless hours creating content as well as adding Instagram and LinkedIn to our Facebook platform. We want to be engaged with you and create a momentum of caring that reaches every cancer patient here in Berrien County who needs our services.

Share us, Like us, Remember us in your giving, but most of all, Tell others about us. We are here and we care.
