From the Desk of Nancy Church, RN

We all have personal connections to different types of cancer. When I think of pancreatic cancer, my mind immediately goes to my Grandmother, or as all of us called her, "MeeMa". As an older adult, she had become a practical nurse and worked the night shift at St. Anthony's Hospital in Michigan City. She was so happy when she found out that I was going into nursing. A year or so after my graduation, she started losing weight and was eventually diagnosed with Stage IV pancreatic cancer. My most vivid memory of her at that time was being with her in a private room after surgery with family gathered around her. Despite being tired and in pain, she had a smile on her face seeing her children and grandchildren around her. That smile stays with me today as I remember MeeMa.

At that time, there was very little that could be done for those with pancreatic cancer aside from surgery. While pancreatic cancer continues to be challenging, treatment may include surgery, radiation, and/or chemotherapy. There are numerous studies that are finding more effective ways to treat this disease. Some of these studies specifically target cancer cells, use vaccines, or other types of immunotherapy.

The pancreas sits behind the stomach where it releases enzymes that aid digestion and produces hormones such as insulin that help manage the blood sugar. Often there are few symptoms when pancreatic cancer occurs until after it has spread to other organs.

Symptoms that may occur include:

- Abdominal pain that radiates to your back
- Loss of appetite or unintended weight loss
- Nausea and/or vomiting
- Yellow of your skin and the whites of the eyes (jaundice)
- Light-colored stools
- Dark-colored urine
- Itchy skin
- Blood clots
- Fatigue
- Elevated blood sugar (the vast majority of people with a new diagnosis of diabetes do not have pancreatic cancer)

You can reduce your risk of pancreatic cancer if you choose a healthy diet, maintain a healthy weight, and not smoke. If there is a family history of pancreatic cancer, especially in conjunction with cancers affecting the GI system, liver, kidney, uterine, breast, or prostate, consider meeting with a genetic counselor to determine if you might benefit from a genetic test to understand your risk of pancreatic cancer or other cancers.


